

ANIMAL RHYTHM CHANT

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IDEAS FOR USE:

- 1. Use as a rhythm chant. Do it in canon. Add dynamics.
- 2. Use as a rhythm piece as AB form or ABA form.
- 3. Use as a basis for a rondo. Do each section in a different tempo.
- 4. Use as one section of a larger piece.
- 5. Add movement. An introduction. A "fade-out" Coda.
- 6. Add improvisation--animal sounds, etc.
- 7. Add instruments. Assign each animal to an instrument and let the students (animals) play when it's their turn in the chant. Use many "colors" for the best effect,--rachet, claves, temple blocks, agogo bells, cabasa, tambourine, flex-a-tone, large drum, tiny drum, etc.
- 8. Talk about which names have one syllable (or, sound), two syllables, and three syllables.
- 9. Make a list of each group-animal names with one part, two parts, etc.
- 10. Let them think of their own animals. Add them to the list and do the chant again, using their animals instead of the ones here.
